APPOINTMENTS TO FELLOWSHIPS IN THE LICK OBSERVATORY  
FOR THE YEAR 1928-1929.

The Martin Kellogg Fellowship for the year 1928-29 has been awarded to Dr. N. T. Bobrovnikoff, the present incumbent. Dr. Bobrovnikoff will be in residence at Mount Hamilton the greater part of the year, but will spend part of the second semester at Berkeley.

The Alexander F. Morrison Fellowship will be held by Mr. Robert S. Richardson, at present an Assistant at the Mount Wilson Observatory. Mr. Richardson is a candidate for the Ph. D. Degree and will spend the greater part of the year in Berkeley.

Lick Observatory Fellowships have been awarded to Mr. Louis Berman (present incumbent), Miss Lois Tripp Slocum (present incumbent), and Mr. A. F. Krieger. All three will be in residence at Mount Hamilton through the year.

 HONORS FOR PACIFIC COAST ASTRONOMERS

At the annual meeting of the National Academy of Sciences, April 23-25, the Draper Gold Medal was awarded to William Hammond Wright, astronomer at the Lick Observatory, for his researches on nebulae, new stars and planetary atmospheres. The report of the Henry Draper Committee, giving in more detail the reasons for the award, is printed in *Science* for May 11, 1928.

At the same meeting, Dr. John August Anderson, astronomer at the Mount Wilson Observatory, was elected to membership in the Academy.
